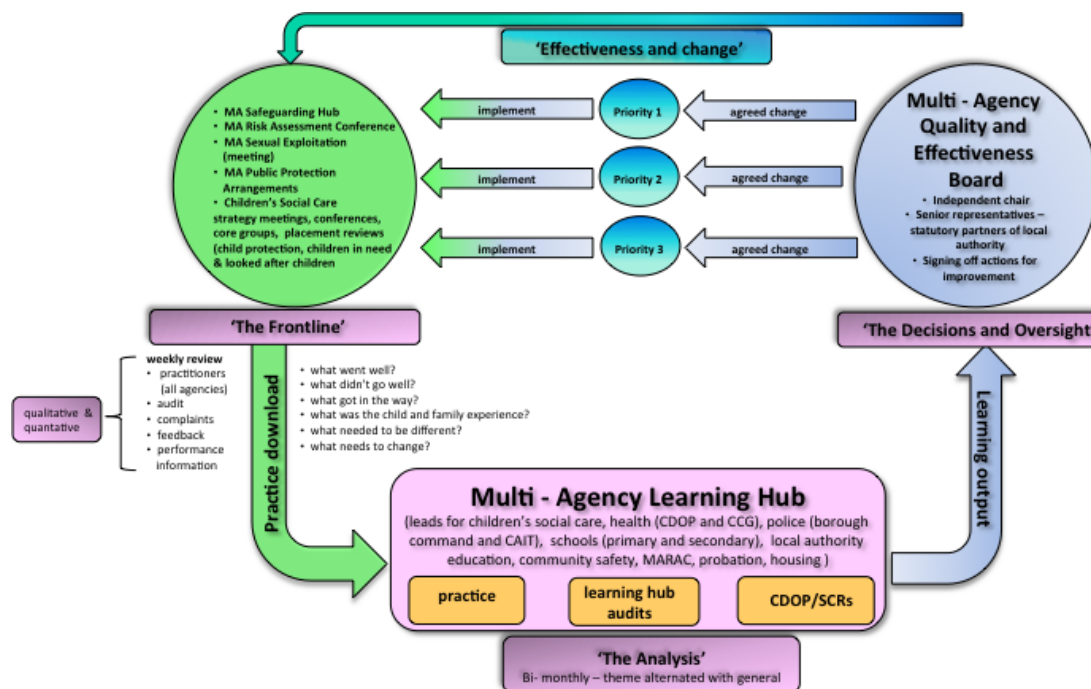


## Developing the work of the Bexley Safeguarding Children Board (BSCB)

### A Back to Practice Approach

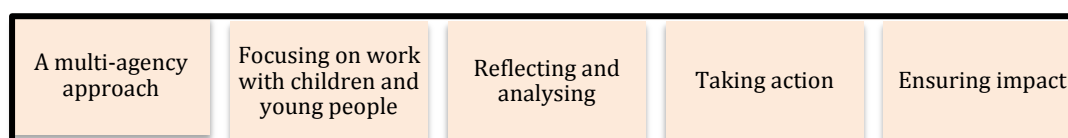
The BSCB is changing. A Back to Practice model was agreed by the Board in March 2016. The model is summarised in the diagram below.



#### Key features of the model are:

- Downloading information on multi-agency front-line practice – left side in green
- Analysing the learning from practice in the multi-agency Learning Hub – middle in pink
- The Quality and Effectiveness Board making decisions and providing oversight – right side in blue
- Impact being made on practice through changes agreed by the Quality and Effectiveness Board and driven through by priority task groups – top middle in darker blue

#### The BSCB back to practice model



Some more information is provided below. There will be regular communication as we implement the model.

**The download**

One of the keys to the back to practice model is making sure there is a clear line of sight to practice and that information is “downloaded” in a usable format for the Learning Hub to interrogate and analyse.

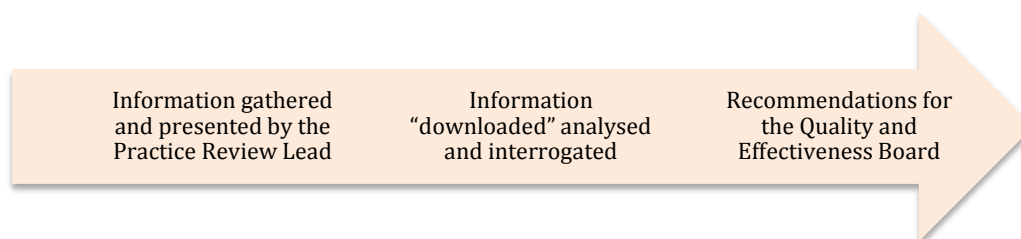
A Practice Review Lead post will be established. The post-holder will be responsible for gathering real-time qualitative and quantitative information from the front-line including from multi-agency meetings and processes. The Practice Review Lead will be focusing on:

- What went well?
- What didn't go well?
- What got in the way
- What needs to be different?
- What needs to change?

The Practice Review lead will also ensure that direct feedback from children, young people, parents and carers is included in the practice download.

**The Learning Hub**

- Meeting bi- monthly
- Replacing the Quality and Audit and Training sub-groups
- Learning from the MASE will be shared through the Learning Hub.
- CDOP and Serious Incident Group arrangements will continue.



The first meeting of the Learning Hub will take place on Tuesday 27 April from 9.30am to 11.30am. This will be a “scoping meeting”, a chance to have input to the development of the Learning Hub. Please contact Jan Blackburn if you would like to attend.

**The Quality and Effectiveness Board**

A multi-agency Quality and Effectiveness Board will meet 6 times a year. This will be a small group of senior managers from key statutory agencies. Membership as follows:

- Children's Services representing the Council
- Police
- CCG
- Education representative
- Acute and community health providers
- Voluntary service council representative

The first meeting of the Quality and Effectiveness Board will take place in May 2016.

A BSCB Partnership Board will meet twice a year. The Partnership Board will include the full LSCB membership as set out in Working Together 2015. In April the Partnership Board will review progress and assess strengths and areas for development in the local safeguarding system.. In November the Partnership Board will consider the learning from annual reports and progress with implementing the work plan. The first meeting of the BSCB Partnership Board will be in November 2016.
