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Lunchtime Learning – Recent Bromley Learning Reviews

Serious Case Reviews (SCR) and Learning Reviews are undertaken by LSCBs to learn lessons to improve the way in which we work both individually and collectively to safeguarding children. LSCBs are required to undertake an SCR where abuse or neglect is known/suspected and either the child has died or been seriously harmed.

In August 2018, the BSCB published SCR Elizabeth which is on our website on the [Serious Case Review](#) webpage.

A lunchtime learning event for SCR Elizabeth will be held on Wednesday 7th November at Bromley Civic Centre (Committee Room 2) at 1.30pm, and repeated on Monday 19th November 1pm at The PRUH Education Centre room T2.

The BSCB are also in the process of completing three other SCRs and two Learning Reviews. Come and listen to the findings and recommendations of these reviews during Lunchtime Learning Sessions. No need to book – just turn up! Each session will be run twice.

Bromley Protocol for Safeguarding Children Affected by Gang Activity / Serious Youth Violence

Bromley's Gangs Protocol was published in July 2018 and can be found on the BSCB website under the [BSCB Policies and Procedures](#) section as well as the section on [Gangs and Young People](#).

The protocol is part of the work plan of the BSCB Vulnerable Adolescents Sub Group and underpins the BSCB Vulnerable Adolescent Strategy. It is aligned with the London Child Protection Procedures, provides a definition of gangs and information on organised criminal groups and violent extremism. It also sets out Bromley processes and pathways for safeguarding this vulnerable group, as well as practice principles and agreed agency response.

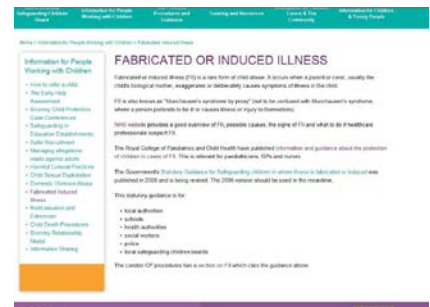
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BSCB Vision
