

Information on the new Bromley 0 to 19 Service



Bromley Healthcare has been commissioned to deliver the new Bromley 0 to 19 Public Health Service from 1 October 2020. This new service brings together Health Visiting, Family Nurse Partnership, Health Support to Schools and the Primary School Screening Programme. Health Visiting (0-4 years)

The Health Visiting Team works in partnership with children and families, as well as other professionals such as health, education, social care and voluntary organisations to provide health support which is tailored to individual needs. The Universal offer includes the delivery of the 5 mandated health reviews:

- Ante-natal health visit
- New baby review
- 6 – 8 week review
- 1 year review
- 2 – 2.5 year review

The service also delivers advice and support on the child's growth and development and family health as well as help for families and children who require additional support.

Family Nurse Partnership (FNP)

The FNP licenced programme (www.fnp.nhs.uk) is for first time mothers, aged 19 and under or 19-24 with additional risk factors and provides a home visiting service from early pregnancy until the child is two years old. The FNP aims to improve maternal health during pregnancy, to achieve the best outcomes for mother and baby, and enhance the child's health and development by helping parents provide the best possible care.

Primary School Screening Programme

This element of the Bromley 0-19 service delivers the National Childhood Measurement Programme to reception and year 6 children and vision screening at 4-5 years for all maintained primary schools and academies in Bromley.

School Nursing (5-19 years)

The School Nursing Team deliver a Public Health Nursing Service for children and young people attending maintained schools and academies in Bromley. The service delivers termly meetings with school health leads to review Individual Health Care Plans, support staff and children with health conditions in school and offer safeguarding, and targeted support to high risk groups in Bromley such as the Youth Offending Service and home educated.
